In the other villages of this section, Myrmikoph, Steni, Peristerona, Agios Isidoros, Magounda, Kynousa, Melandra, Zakharia, Philousa, Tremithousa, Evretou and Sarama, there is nothing worthy of record: and with a passing reference to the ruined monastery of Khrysolakkona above Myrmikoph, of which nothing remains but the shell of a large church with triple apse, some traces of a cloister at its west end, and foundations of out-buildings, we may pass the Poli river and ascend the lofty ridge which divides it from the Ezuza. It is this ridge which, curving northwards, runs out at last into the Akamas, but having already described this extremity, we begin with the villages which lie just within or south of the line drawn from Cape Drepano to the mouth of the Poli river, which we have assumed to be the limit of the Akamas proper.
